
Men's Health Clinic Team Bios:



Morgan Burke, NP

Morgan is the lead urology nurse practitioner at The Kirklin Clinic of UAB Hospital. She joined the practice in 2017, having previously served at Vanderbilt Urology in Nashville, Tenn. Morgan teamed up with colleague Jeffrey Nix, MD, to start a telehealth program for UAB Urology. She specializes in restoring urologic health in men suffering from complications following cancer treatment or due to aging. She cares for patients with erectile dysfunction, genitourinary stricture disease, urinary incontinence, neurogenic bladder, and Peyronie's disease. She helps ensure that men undergoing surgery have completed the necessary preoperative testing, and she provides postoperative care to men following reconstructive and prosthetic surgery.

Morgan was the first nurse practitioner in Alabama to be certified to perform injections for Peyronie's disease. She enjoys hiking, Kentucky Wildcats basketball, and spending time with her husband, an orthopaedic surgery resident at UAB.

Morgan currently is accepting new patients in clinic and via the telehealth program.



Peter Kolettis, MD

Dr. Kolettis joined the UAB faculty in 1998, after completing his residency in urology and a fellowship in male infertility at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. He has expertise in all aspects of male infertility treatment, including microsurgery, which he performs regularly. Dr. Kolettis has published numerous articles in peer-reviewed journals on male infertility and vasectomy reversal. He has been invited to give presentations on male infertility and vasectomy reversal at national and international meetings. He served on the American Urological Association's Male Infertility Best Practice Policy Update Panel, a group that makes recommendations on the evaluation and treatment of male infertility. As part of this group, he helped develop guidelines

for evaluating and treating azoospermia, varicocele, and infertility after vasectomy. Dr. Kolettis works with a specialized team of gynecologists, nurses, and laboratory personnel to provide comprehensive care for couples with infertility.

Patrick Selph, MD

Dr. Selph specializes in reconstruction of the male genitourinary tract. He underwent advanced training in treating urethral stricture disease, ureteral stricture disease, erectile dysfunction, male urinary incontinence, Peyronie's disease, and complications from pelvic radiation therapy. He currently is the only urologist in Alabama who is fellowship-trained in genitourinary cancer survivorship, a field that focuses on the urologic complications of cancer treatment. Dr. Selph offers a wide range of treatment options for men's health conditions, including urethroplasty surgery for urethral blockage, penile prosthesis surgery, artificial urinary sphincter and male sling placement, surgery and injections for penile curvature, buried penis repair,

and treatment of cancer complications.

James Bryant, MD

Dr. Bryant has practiced general urology for nearly 30 years, including the past 10 years at UAB Medicine, and he specializes in medical and surgical treatment of erectile dysfunction. He treats enlargement of the prostate (benign prostatic hyperplasia, or BPH) and is one of only a few urologists in the South who performs holmium laser enucleation of the prostate to treat this condition. In addition, he soon will offer the minimally invasive UroLift System for treating BPH.
