While urgent

care clinics are generally open 7 days a week and appointments are not

needed, they do not provide care for life-threatening illnesses and injuries like a Freestanding Emergency Department. The UAB Medicine FED in Gardendale is:

- Equipped to handle nearly any medical emergency, including heart attack, stroke, minor trauma, and much more
- Open 24/7, 365 days per year
- Treat serious injuries and medical conditions in children and adults of all ages
- Staffed with board-certified emergency physicians and experienced emergency nurses
- Equipped with a full range of lab & diagnostic imaging services



Cost of Freestanding Emergency Department Care vs. Urgent Care

Visiting an urgent care clinic usually means lower out-of-pocket costs – with or without insurance coverage – than visiting an FED. Urgent care clinics, such as UAB Medicine Urgent Care in downtown Birmingham, can be a cheaper and faster alternative for non-emergent care.
